#### I. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the City Council reject the claim for damages presented by Robert Littlejohn Sr.

#### II. BACKGROUND:

Mr. Littlejohn filed a claim with the City of Coalinga (see attached) on October 22, 2018. The claim was sent to George Hills Company for review of dangerous conditions for lack of guardrails, and negligent design/maintenance, among other items. After review and investigation of the claim it was determined the property is not owned or controlled by the City of Coalinga.

#### III. DISCUSSION:

George Hills Company recommends rejection of claim due to Government Code section 830 (c) defines "public property" and "property of a public entity" as "real or personal property" that is "owned or controlled by the public entity". Staff has confirmed the City of Coalinga neither owns nor maintains the interstate highway or off ramp where the loss occurred. With this in mind George Hills Company recommends the City of Coalinga reject this claim.

#### IV. ALTERNATIVES:

Accept the claim (staff does not recommend).



#### When did damage or injury occur?

Date: April 21, 2018

Time: 3:30 p.m.

#### Place of accident:

Northbound Interstate 5 offramp to Harris Ranch in Coalinga, California.

#### How did damage or injury occur?

On April 21, 2018, at or about 3:30 p.m., Claimant Robert Littlejohn, along with his wife, decedent Sharon Littlejohn, were riding in a 2001 Executive Monaco Coach Motorhome, driven by Claimant Robert Littlejohn, on the northbound offramp of Interstate 5 to Harris Ranch in the City of Coalinga, County of Fresno, State of California. Claimant was driving in a lawful and reasonable manner.

At said time and place, the Monaco Coach Motorhome malfunctioned and began to accelerate, leaving the roadway and plunging down a steep embankment, causing injury to Claimant and causing the death of his wife, Sharon Littlejohn.

What particular act or omission do you claim caused the injury or damages (Give name of City employee causing the injury or damage, if known)

Claimant is informed and believes that the City of Coalinga owned, operated, designed, constructed, maintained, inspected, repaired, and controlled this section of roadway, including the roadway where this motor vehicle left the roadway and plunged down a steep embankment, as well as the surrounding area.

Upon information and belief, the City of Coalinga was negligent and careless in the design, construction, maintenance, inspection, repair, and control of the northbound Interstate 5 offramp to Harris Ranch in Coalinga, California and the adjacent area, such that the roadway presented a dangerous, defective and hazardous condition.

At all relevant times herein mentioned, the design, construction, maintenance, inspection, repair and control of the roadway, and surrounding area, presented a reasonably foreseeable substantial risk of harm to members of the public who were lawfully operating vehicles on the roadway.

This incident was directly and legally caused by acts and/or omissions of the City of Coalinga and/or the employees of these agencies, including, but not limited to

- 1. Failure to provide guardrails or other protections along the side of the roadway to prevent motorists from plunging off of the edge;
- 2. Creation of a trap for motorists exiting the offramp of northbound Interstate 5 to Harris Ranch;
- 3. Failure to provide and/or maintain adequate signs, signals, "active" warning devices, channelizers, pavement markings and striping;
- 4. The creation of a roadway slope, surface and configuration that was unsafe and dangerous;
- 5. Failure to provide a safe and reasonable geometric alignment of the roadway;
- 6. Failure to warn of and/or prevent and/or correct a "dangerous condition" (a condition of property that creates a substantial [as distinguished from a minor, trivial or insignificant] risk of injury when such property or adjacent property is used with due care in a manner

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in which it is reasonably foreseeable that it would be used) on or immediately adjacent to, public property;

- 7. Failure to post additional/supplemental signage, lighting, traffic control devices, and/or pavement markings in view of a significant accident history, history of near misses, and complaint history from motorists in this area that was known or should have been known by the City of Coalinga;
- 8. The failure to properly respond to the accident history in this area, including nearby similarly situated intersections and complaints regarding automobiles leaving the roadway and plunging down the steep embankment adjacent to the roadway;
- 10. Creation, maintenance, and/or failure to remedy the combination of factors (including but not limited to roadway configuration, guardrails, striping, signage, and shadows) that create glare, lack of conspicuity, or other visibility phenomenon that contribute to motorists leaving the properly marked lanes of the roadway;

The above factors, both individually and in combination, created a dangerous condition of public property and presented a substantial risk of injury to members of the general public, including Claimant, who used the property, or adjacent property, with reasonable care, and in a reasonably foreseeable manner. Likewise, these factors, both individually and in combination, constituted a dangerous condition which had been, but was not, remedied by agents and employees of the City of Coalinga.

The City of Coalinga negligently created and/or possessed knowledge, actual or constructive, of the above-described dangerous conditions, as well as the hazards and defects present in said roadway, and the surrounding area.

As a direct and legal result of the above-described dangerous condition and the negligence and carelessness of the City of Coalinga, acting by and through its employees and agents, Claimant plunged down the embankment bordering the roadway, causing the aforementioned injuries and damages.

As a further direct and proximate result of the matters set forth above and of said accident and injuries, Claimant has suffered and sustained the aforementioned economic (special) damages and noneconomic (general) damages.

The City of Coalinga. Claimants do not presently know the names of the agents, servants, and employees of the City of Coalinga who contributed to said injuries and damages.
